

Explore Branson: What to Look for in 2024

February 22, 2024 – Nestled in the lakeside beauty of the Ozark Mountains, Branson, Missouri is one of America's greatest family destinations. Because it sits right in the middle of the country, Branson is within a day's drive for about half of the American population, and there's always a reason to visit and discover what's new in the destination. Here's a look at 10 new things to know about in Branson this year:

ATTRACTIONS

<u>Silver Dollar City</u>: Ride the Midwest's Largest Indoor Family Roller Coaster 399 Silver Dollar City Parkway, Branson, MO 65616

Legendary family-owned theme park <u>Silver Dollar City</u> opens for the season on Saturday, March 9. And this spring, the 1880s-themed park will debut the Midwest's largest indoor family roller coaster, "<u>Fire In The Hole</u>." Steeped in Ozark Mountain history, the experience of Fire In The Hole is a fictional account of the night a former Ozark Mountain mining town – which Silver Dollar City sits on today – was burned to the ground by vigilantes. Riders board their own pumper wagons and band together to save the town and battle the fire as they travel through a five-story building. During the ride, recruits experience three drops, a quick splash-landing, and high-resolution onboard audio. The coaster is inspired by the park's 1972 Fire In The Hole attraction, which retired at the end of 2023, after operating 51 seasons and carrying more than 25 million riders. The \$30 million investment will be unveiled in the park's newly incorporated Fire District, which also includes 10 family-friendly attractions, a new merchandise location, and new food venue featuring the park's famous handmade "pretzel dogs."



Ozark Nights: Take an Immersive Night Walk Where the Forest Glows and the Folktales Grow 1001 West End Parkway, Branson, MO 65616

Opening this spring, Ozark Nights will give its guests the opportunity to experience the forest in an enchanting new light while exploring a nighttime mystery. The immersive night walk sits on the former homestead of the Owen family, settlers who disappeared without a trace on the winter solstice in the late 1880s. The experience takes visitors back in time on an adventure that includes a 7/10-mile paved, self-paced walk along an illuminated trail and the opportunity to enjoy time around the property's firepits. Refreshments will be available for purchase. Bookings are available beginning May 2.

Shepherd of the Hills: Walk Among the Treetops on a New Trail

The Ozarks caught everyone's attention in 1907, when Harold Bell Wright's novel, *The Shepherd of the Hills*, was published ... and the <u>Shepherd of the Hills</u> farm has been a favorite attraction among Branson visitors for decades. Today, the family entertainment park and farm is centered around the historic farm tour and legendary outdoor drama of the namesake novel, with a variety of other attractions, shows and festivals. New this year, <u>Shepherd's TreeTop Sky Trail</u> allows visitors to walk among the treetops on more than 600 feet of suspension bridges overlooking the Ozarks.
